particularly the 28 bus route from Jubilee Campus into the city centre.

Here at the University of Nottingham we understand that moving to a new city can be really

daunting. So, we thought we'd show you how easy it is to get around using the buses.

The number 28 Pink line bus route takes you from outside Wollaton Road entrance and exit to

Jubilee Campus straight into town. It stops off at the Victoria shopping centre, along the route it also

stops near to Raleigh Park a short walk from St Peter's Court and other shops such as a Lidl and

there is a B&M as well.

Due to covid-19, your bus experience may be slightly different than you're used to, face coverings

are mandatory on all Nottingham city transport buses apart from for those who are exempt. For

Hand sanitiser is also available on all services provided by NCT, as well as masks and hand sanitiser.

You should also aim to sit as far away as possible from others, ideally in a window seat.

Nottingham city transport have made it quick and convenient for students to explore the city of

Nottingham without breaking the bank

Students are encouraged to pay using the NCTX buses app, which offers a £1.70 student single ticket

on all routes in Nottingham, and a £3.40 unlimited travel ticket for 24 hours. However, paper tickets

can still be purchased from the driver, using the exact change.

An academic season pass on the NCT buses costs just £259 for unlimited travel between 1st

September 2020 and 31st July 2021. However, for students travelling less regularly, there is now the

option of bulk buying 50 or 100 individual days for £83 and £138 respectively, and use each day as

needed.
